

# Day 5—Following God to the Amazon Jungle

The missionaries on the *Saddle Ridge Ranch* 2010 mission DVD were Journeyman, missionaries who serve for two years. LJ and Bobby aren't in South America anymore, but Xtreme team ministry continues!

Here's an update from IMB missionary Jeff Johnson, who works with Xtreme team.

We now have teams in the jungle of Ecuador working with the Chachi (CHA-chee) people, one team in the Amazon jungle of Peru working with the Huitoto (wee-TOH-toh) people, and two teams in Bolivia. A men's team is investigating some people groups to work with, and a women's team is working with the Quechua (KEH-chew-ah) women in the Andes Mountains. They are discipling the women in their faith.

2. For the newborns of Xtreme team families. Three families have had babies within the last four months!
3. That the mission leaders in all three countries will have wisdom related to reaching their people groups.

5. For LJ and Bobby who are continuing to follow God's will for their lives.

**Update from LJ:** *Life in the United States has been quite full for me since my time in the village. I am now studying at Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary with the intention of returning to village life on the mission field as soon as possible. I married another Journeyman, a young lady who served in West Africa. While we are studying we are trying our best to reach out to the international community in Raleigh, NC, until we can go back overseas again.*

**Update from Bobby:** *Since I have been back from the jungle, I have been very busy. I married a beautiful missionary named Maridith only two months after returning to the United States. We traveled and did a lot of speaking during the first few months of our marriage. We spent the next seven months working with an international outreach organization, a ministry that we have been involved with for several years. From there we went to France to learn how to speak French. We did this because we are planning to be missionaries in a French-speaking part of Africa. In January we moved to Dallas, Texas. We are both going to college and we like it a lot. My wife is studying to be a teacher and I am studying languages.*
